

# Travelling to Suffolk Rural - Transport Guide 2023/24

# **Suffolk County Council public transport**

For routes 118 and 119 you can apply to Suffolk County Council for a discretionary travel pass (16-18 year olds only). Endeavour cards are accepted on pay-daily fares. For more information and online applications, please refer to the Suffolk On Board website, email <a href="mailto:passenger.transport@suffolk.gov.uk">passenger.transport@suffolk.gov.uk</a> or call them on 0345 606 6171.

#### Suffolk New College dedicated transport

In March 2023, we published an update, explaining the College was out to tender for the following dedicated bus routes:

- · RC1 Thorrington via Colchester
- RC3 Leiston via Saxmundham
- RC5 Sudbury via Hadleigh
- RC6 Clacton via Manningtree
- RC7 Felixstowe via Woodbridge

This Transport Guide contains all the information you need about the outcome of this process and the options available to you – including new complimentary shuttle bus travel from 2 pick-up points in central lpswich.

Whether you are a new student travelling to Suffolk Rural for the first time or a progressing student returning to us in September, you are encouraged to read through the information in this guide carefully.

We have arranged the information in an A-Z style based on some main locations, so that you can more easily view the options available. # **Frequently Asked Questions**

# When should I apply for my college travel pass?

You should apply for your college travel pass as soon as possible from this point, using the <u>College's transport application form</u> to indicate how you wish to travel. You must do this, otherwise you risk being unable to travel to college. Once you have submitted your college transport application form you can then purchase your travel pass through the <u>College's online shop</u>, 'EVOLVE'.

# What about paying for my college travel pass?

Apply for your travel pass first of all (using the College's transport application form) and then purchase your travel pass (no 'EVOLVE' purchase is required for SB1 or SB2 shuttle buses).

You are encouraged to purchase your college travel pass as soon as possible from this point as you cannot be issued with a travel pass without payment first being made. You must have a valid travel pass to travel by train and public bus otherwise you are breaking the law and risk being fined. You must also have a valid travel pass for the College's bus routes. Travel passes <u>must</u> be purchased through 'EVOLVE'. This is <u>very</u> important, because if you apply subsequently for a bursary and you are assessed as eligible, we can only reimburse travel costs that have been purchased through 'EVOLVE'.

'EVOLVE' is the College's online shop, accessed at <a href="www.suffolk.ac.uk/shop">www.suffolk.ac.uk/shop</a>. Travel passes can be purchased termly at a cost of £250 per term. There is no option to purchase an annual pass. Although we will reimburse you if you are eligible on assessment of your application for support through the bursary, should you leave the College early no refunds can be given as the College purchases the travel passes on your behalf.

# Is there any financial support available?

The College offers a number of different bursary schemes to students who meet the eligibility criteria. You must apply online to be considered for a bursary. For more details of the College's bursary scheme, access www.suffolk.ac.uk/bursary

If you are making application for the bursary, please note that a travel pass will not be issued until we have fully assessed your bursary application. Therefore, you might wish to think about timings and consider whether you do need to purchase a travel pass in the first instance.

If you do purchase a travel pass and your bursary application is approved, then the cost of your travel pass (only if purchased through 'EVOLVE') will be reimbursed to you.

No reimbursement will be made for tickets purchased individually or for travel passes not purchased through the College's 'EVOLVE' system.

#### Specialist transport

For students with special educational needs who may be unable to travel independently, please contact your local County Council for further information about specialist transport arrangements for post-16 education.

## Can I drive my own vehicle to campus?

Students can choose to bring their own vehicles on site. There is plenty of parking available and all car parks are free. Students must register their vehicle details at the point of enrolment and collect a 23/24 parking permit from their curriculum team. This <u>must</u> be displayed at all times when on site. (Polite notice: The College reserves the right to withdraw your right to park on campus should this become necessary. The College's

expectations will be explained to you so that you understand when it might be deemed necessary to remove a student's right to park – either temporarily or permanently).

# **Suffolk New College travel overview**

#### We have 3 dedicated bus routes for 23/24:

- RC3 Leiston via Saxmundham (as existing), operated by Belle Coaches
- RC5 Sudbury via Hadleigh (revised), operated by Konectbus
- RC8 Colchester North Station, via Ipswich railway station (new for 23/24), operated by Beestons

Termly travel passes cost £250.

You <u>must</u> complete the College's transport application form. Travel passes will be issued directly from the College.

# \*\* New for 23/24\*\* - We have 2 Ipswich shuttle bus routes (these are complimentary, at no charge):

- SB1 Ipswich railway station
- SB2 Ipswich Old Cattle Market bus station

We are pleased to be able to offer complimentary shuttle bus travel for 23/24.

The shuttle buses will leave from Ipswich railway station and Ipswich Old Cattle Market bus station.

Any student who wishes to travel to Suffolk Rural on one of our shuttle bus routes can do so free of charge. BUT - You <u>must</u> complete the College's transport application form. Travel passes will be issued directly from the College.

## Travelling into central lpswich by train

If travelling into Ipswich by train, you must purchase a travel pass via the College's 'EVOLVE' system.

This will get you a Greater Anglia student pass which can be used to travel to Ipswich where you will then board the complimentary SB1 shuttle bus from the railway station. In addition, you will also be able to travel between your chosen station and Ipswich free of charge on evenings, weekends and half-terms with your travel pass – at no extra cost.

The SB1 will be located at bus stand C, located at the front of the station and will depart Mondays – Fridays at 08:15. The SB1 is a Beestons double-decker vehicle. To find it, exit the station and head to the right, until you see stand C.

We have given you some suggested timetables, these are meant as a guide only. Purchasing a travel pass does not buy you a seat on that specific service. The travel pass will enable you to travel between your home station and Ipswich. You are encouraged to refer to Greater Anglia online for full details of timetables. The

suggested service we have identified will ensure you get to the station before the SB1 is scheduled to depart (a later train will not get you to Ipswich on time for you to use the SB1).

Important reminder: Do not purchase your travel pass direct through Greater Anglia. ONLY purchase through 'EVOLVE'. If you purchase outside of 'EVOLVE' and you are later assessed as being eligible for the bursary, any travel costs incurred will not be reimbursed.

#### Travelling into central Ipswich by bus

If travelling into Ipswich by bus, you must purchase a travel pass via the College's 'EVOLVE' system.

This will get you a First Bus travel pass (Ipswich Reds) which can be used to travel to Ipswich where you will then board the complimentary SB2 shuttle bus from the Old Cattle Market bus station. In addition, you will also be able to travel between your area and Ipswich free of charge on evenings, weekends and half-terms with your travel pass – at no extra cost.

You will get off your Ipswich Reds bus at the Cattle Market to get on the SB2. The SB2 will be located at bus stand L at the Old Cattle Market bus station.

We have given you some suggested timetables, these are meant as a guide only. Purchasing a travel pass does not buy you a seat on that specific service. The travel pass will enable you to travel between your starting station and Ipswich. Timetable information regarding First Buses can be accessed by clicking on the service number link in the relevant bus service timetable.

The suggested service we have identified will ensure you get to the bus station before the SB2 is scheduled to depart (a later bus will not get you to Ipswich on time for you to use the SB2).

Important reminder: Do not purchase your travel pass direct through Ipswich Reds. ONLY purchase through 'EVOLVE'. If you purchase outside of 'EVOLVE' and you are later assessed as being eligible for the bursary, any travel costs incurred will not be reimbursed.

Your travel pass will be issued by Ipswich Reds, via their smartphone App. (HOWEVER, please do not download the app until you have received instructions from the College on what to do next, following your travel pass application).

# Bury St Edmunds (train from Bury, then shuttle bus to Rural, via Ipswich)

If you live in Bury St Edmunds or the surrounding area, your journey to Suffolk Rural begins by train.

Our travel pass for the train costs £250 per term. You must complete the College's transport application form.

You can get an earlier train if you wish, we have given this one as an example. This one will ensure you arrive at the railway station before the shuttle bus is scheduled to depart.

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Railway Station, you will need to board the SB1 (Railway station shuttle bus). This will be located at bus Stand C, located towards the front of the station (as you exit the station entrance, bus stand C is located over towards the right).

The SB1 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way as this is a direct route only.

You will not be charged for travelling on the SB1. This is a new complimentary college shuttle bus for all passengers, but you MUST make application for a seat so that we know you want to travel on it.

The SB1 is not available for members of the public, it is just for travelling between the railway station and Suffolk Rural.

You need to make application directly to the College for the SB1, so that we can issue you a travel pass. (Please use the College's transport application form. You only need to complete one application form, on there you indicate how you wish to travel to the College, i.e. train and shuttle bus).

## Colchester (train to Colchester, then dedicated bus to Rural, via Ipswich)

If you live in Colchester or the surrounding area, your journey to Suffolk Rural begins EITHER by train OR on the dedicated RC8 from Colchester North railway station.

Our travel pass for this route costs £250 per term. You must complete the College's transport application form. (The cost includes train travel and the RC8. You will not be charged at the point on the journey where the RC8 becomes the SB1 - at that point in its journey there is no charge).

You can get an earlier train if you wish, we have given this one as an example. This one will ensure you arrive at Colchester North railway station before the RC8 is scheduled to depart.

When you arrive at Ipswich Railway Station, you <u>must stay on the vehicle</u>. At this point in its journey, the name of the route changes from RC8 to be called the SB1 (Ipswich railway station shuttle bus).

The SB1 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way as this is a direct route only. You will not be charged for travelling on the SB1. This is a new complimentary college shuttle bus for all passengers, but you MUST make application for a seat so that we know you want to travel on it.

The SB1 is not available for members of the public, it is just for travelling between the railway station and Suffolk Rural.

You need to make application directly to the College for the RC8, so that we can issue you a travel pass. (Please use the College's transport application form. You only need to complete one application form, on there you indicate how you wish to travel to the College, i.e. train and bus, OR by bus if your journey begins at Colchester North station).

The RC8 (SB1) route is operated by Beestons and will be a double-decker vehicle.

# Felixstowe (bus from Felixstowe, then shuttle bus to Rural, via Ipswich)

If you are travelling to Suffolk Rural from Felixstowe or the surrounding area, your journey to Suffolk Rural starts by travelling into central Ipswich by public bus.

Our travel pass for the number 75 bus costs £250 per term. You <u>must</u> complete the College's transport application form.

You can get an earlier bus if you wish, we have given this one as an example. This one will ensure you arrive at the bus station before the shuttle bus is scheduled to depart.

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Old Cattle Market Bus Station, you will need to board the SB2 (Old Cattle Market shuttle bus). This will be located at the Old Cattle Market stand L.

The SB2 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way as this is a direct route only. You will not be charged for travelling on the SB2. This is a complimentary college shuttle bus for all passengers, but you MUST make application for a seat so that we know you want to travel on it.

The SB2 is not available for members of the public, it is just for travelling between the Old Cattle Market bus station and Suffolk Rural.

You need to make application directly to the College for the SB2, so that we can issue you a travel pass. (Please use the College's transport application form. You only need to complete one application form, on there you indicate how you wish to travel to the College, ie bus and shuttle bus).

If you live in Harwich or the surrounding area, your journey to Suffolk Rural begins by train.

Our travel pass for the train costs £250 per term. You must complete the College's transport application form.

You can get an earlier train if you wish, we have given this one as an example. This one will ensure you arrive at the railway station before the shuttle bus is scheduled to depart.

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Railway Station, you will need to board the SB1 (Railway station shuttle bus). This will be located at bus Stand C, located towards the front of the station (as you exit the station entrance, bus stand C is located over towards the right).

The SB1 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way as this is a direct route only.

# **Ipswich**

New for 23/24, the College is offering complimentary travel on 2 central Ipswich shuttle bus routes.

Both are contracted for college use only and will travel direct (to and from) Suffolk Rural.

Members of the public are not permitted to travel on the shuttle buses.

Shuttle bus 1 (SB1) will enable <u>any student</u> wishing to travel from Ipswich railway station to Suffolk Rural to do so free of charge.

Shuttle bus 2 (SB2) will enable <u>any student</u> wishing to travel from Ipswich Old Cattle Market bus station to Suffolk Rural to do so free of charge.

If you can get to one of these central Ipswich pick-up points, you can travel on the SB1 or SB2 at no charge, but you <u>MUST</u> complete a college transport application form because you will need a valid travel pass.

The SB is operated by Beestons and will be a double-decker vehicle

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Railway Station, you will need to board the SB1 (Railway station shuttle bus). This will be located at bus stand C, located towards the front of the station (as you exit the station entrance, bus stand C is located over towards the right).

#### SB2 timetable:

The SB2 is operated by Beestons and will be either a single OR double-decker vehicle

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Old Cattle Market Bus Station, you will need to board the SB2 (Old Cattle Market shuttle bus). This will be located at the Old Cattle Market stand L.

Both the SB1 and SB2 will come straight to Suffolk Rural (the same on the return journey), no stops will be made on the way, as both journeys are direct.

Travel is complimentary and you must apply for a place.

(Please use the College's transport application form, on there you indicate whether you need the SB1 or the SB2. You will receive a travel pass for either the SB1 <u>OR</u> the SB2. You can only apply for one of the shuttle buses because we will need to know how many students will need to travel on these vehicles).

# Leiston (dedicated bus to Rural)

If you are travelling to Suffolk Rural from Leiston and the surrounding area, your journey is on a dedicated bus route.

This route was in operation last year, there have been no changes to the route.

Our travel pass for RC3 costs £250 per term. You must complete the College's transport application form.

# Stowmarket (A: train from Stowmarket, then shuttle bus to Rural, via Ipswich <u>OR</u> B: bus from Stowmarket, then shuttle bus to Rural, via Ipswich)

If you are travelling to Suffolk Rural from Stowmarket and the surrounding area, you can do so by travelling into Ipswich by train or bus. At Ipswich, you will be able to get a complimentary seat on either the SB1 (railway station shuttle bus) or the SB2 (Old Cattle Market bus station shuttle bus).

You can get an earlier train if you wish, we have given this one as an example. This one will ensure you arrive at the railway station before the shuttle bus is scheduled to depart.

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Railway Station, you need to board the SB1 (railway station shuttle bus). This will be located at bus Stand C, located towards the front of the station (as you exit the station entrance, bus stand C is located over towards the right).

The SB1 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way. This is a direct route only. You will not be charged for travelling on the SB1. This is a complimentary college shuttle bus for all passenger, but you MUST make application for a seat so that we know you want to travel on it.

The SB1 is not available for members of the public, it is just for travelling between the railway station and Suffolk Rural.

The SB2 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way. This is a direct route only. You will not be charged for travelling on the SB2. This is a complimentary college shuttle bus for all passengers, but you MUST make application for a seat so that we know you will want to travel on it.

# Sudbury (dedicated bus to Rural)

If you are travelling to Suffolk Rural from Leiston and the surrounding areas, your journey is on a dedicated bus route.

The RC5 route was in operation last year, but the journey required partial travel on a different (public) vehicle, that being the number 91.

For 23/24, the original timetable has been reinstated, meaning there will be no need to change vehicles at any point.

Our travel pass for RC5 costs £250 per term. You must complete the College's transport application form.

Our travel pass for the number 64 bus costs £250 per term. You <u>must</u> complete the College's transport application form.

Once you have arrived at Ipswich Old Cattle Market Bus Station, you will need to board the SB2 (Old Cattle Market shuttle bus). This will be located at the Old Cattle Market stand L.

The SB2 will come straight to Suffolk Rural, no stops will be made along the way as this is a direct route only. You will not be charged for travelling on the SB2. This is a complimentary college shuttle bus for all passengers, but you MUST make application for a seat so that we know you want to travel on it.

The SB2 is not available for members of the public, it is just for travelling between the Old Cattle Market bus station and Suffolk Rural.

You need to make application directly to the College for the SB2, so that we can issue you a travel pass. (Please use the College's transport application form. You only need to complete one application form, on there you indicate how you wish to travel to the College, ie bus and shuttle bus).



# **Suffolk County Council public transport**

For routes 118 / 119 you can apply to Suffolk County Council for a discretionary travel pass (16-18 year olds only).
