

Travelling to Suffolk Rural - Transport Guide 2024/25

We have 3 dedicated bus routes to Suffolk Rural

- RC3 – Leiston via Saxmundham operated by Belle Coaches
- RC5 – Sudbury via Hadleigh operated by Konectbus T/A Hedingham & Chambers
- RC8 – Colchester North Station (via Ipswich railway station) operated by Beestons

Termly travel passes cost £280.

You must complete the College's transport application form

RC3 from Leiston (dedicated bus to Rural)

This route was in operation last year, there have been no changes.

RC5 from Sudbury (dedicated bus to Rural)

This route was in operation last year, there have been no changes.

Our travel pass for this route costs £280 per term.

RC8 from Colchester North Station (double decker vehicle)

This route was in operation last year, there have been no changes.

If you live in Colchester or the surrounding area, your journey to Suffolk Rural begins either by train or on the dedicated RC8.

Ipswich Railway Station (where the RC8 becomes the SB1 ** and you stay on the vehicle**)	08:15	17:10
Suffolk Rural	08:45	1640

When you arrive at Ipswich Railway Station, you must stay on the vehicle. At this point in its journey, the name of the route changes from RC8 to the SB1 ('Shuttle Bus 1'). Other learners will get on the vehicle at this point, to travel onwards to Suffolk Rural. This is why you must stay on it when you arrive in to Ipswich railway station from Colchester. The SB1 is a non-stop route and cannot be used by members of the public. It is for college use only.

Our travel pass for this route costs £280 per term. This cost includes train travel and for the RC8.

When should I apply for my college travel pass?

You should apply for your college travel pass as soon as possible from this point, using the College's Rural Transport application form <https://www.suffolk.ac.uk/transport-form> to indicate how you wish to travel.

What about paying for my college travel pass?

You are encouraged to purchase your college travel pass as soon as possible from this point as you cannot be issued with a travel pass without payment first being made.

You must have a valid travel pass when travelling. If your journey includes an element of travel by train, you would be breaking the law if you were to travel without a valid pass and would risk getting fined.

Travel passes must be purchased through 'EVOLVE'. This is very important, because if you apply subsequently for a bursary and you are assessed as eligible, we can only reimburse travel costs that have been purchased through 'EVOLVE'.

'EVOLVE' is the College's online shop, accessed at www.suffolk.ac.uk/shop. Travel passes can be purchased termly at a cost of £280 per term. There is no option to purchase an annual pass. Although we will reimburse you if you are eligible on assessment of your application for support through the bursary, should you leave the College early no refunds can be given as the College purchases the travel passes on your behalf.

Is there any financial support available?

The College offers a number of different bursary schemes to students who meet the eligibility criteria. You must apply online to be considered for a bursary. For more details of the College's bursary scheme, access www.suffolk.ac.uk/bursary

If you are making application for the bursary, please note that a travel pass will not be issued until we have fully assessed your bursary application. Therefore, you might wish to think about timings and consider whether you do need to purchase a travel pass in the first instance.

If you do purchase a travel pass and your bursary application is approved, then the cost of your travel pass (only if purchased through 'EVOLVE') will be reimbursed to you.

No reimbursement will be made for tickets purchased individually or for travel passes not purchased through the College's 'EVOLVE' system.
